This year's short legislative session wrapped up on March 7, and our organizing team and lobbyist worked hard to help pass 4 (out of 7) bills on our legislative agenda!

Though our top priority bill, the **Keep Our Care Act**, stalled at the eleventh hour, ProChoice Washington activists worked in
coalition to modernize workplace safety
and equity protections for strippers, to end
cost sharing for PEP (the lifesaving HIV
prophylaxis mediation), to enact
consequences for non-consensual condom
removal and tampering, and to protect
patients from predatory Crisis Pregnancy
Centers.

I'm also excited to announce that our team is growing! In March, Paul Dillon joined our team as Political Manager!

Like our Organizing Director, Sarah Dixit, Paul is based in Spokane.

For the City of Spokane, Paul serves as a newly elected reproductive freedom champion on the City Council. (More on Paul below!)

As we look toward summer, we are preparing for the potential challenges that lie ahead: there is a possibility that the Supreme Court will restrict access to mifepristone nationwide, and the upcoming presidential and gubernatorial elections will have far-reaching consequences for abortion access and reproductive freedom.

PASSING POLICIES

Legislative Action: Over 600 activists wrote emails or notes to lawmakers, and many of them testified and showed up at our Lobby Day to elevate the Keep Our Care Act (KOCA).

Because of this broad support, KOCA made it out of the Senate for the first time in bill history!

Unfortunately, when KOCA was sent to the House, Democratic leadership tallied their votes, and realized there weren't enough votes to bring the bill for a floor vote.

We always knew that passing KOCA would be a multi-year campaign, and we're not giving up!

Pro-Choice Washington will continue the work to educate lawmakers in the interim session and build power for next year's session.

WORKING WITH ELECTED OFFICIALS


